May 1 - Rafflemania

One of the most popular events of the year...
Rafflemania! Members bring gently used fiber related items to "raffle" off as a guild fundraiser.
This includes items such as quilt books, yarn, crochet and knitting supplies, sewing supplies, sewing patterns, gadgets, rulers, templates, threads, bobbin holders, needles, pins and of course, those fabrics that you once loved and now categorize as hideous. (Only fiber related

items and no magazines.) Please bundle items together either in bags or with rubber bands to keep them from intermingling with other stacks.

How this works:

Items are placed on the tables next to paper bags. Members purchase and fill out raffle tickets to try for items they wish to win. (Hint: Return address labels come in handy for this!)

A name is drawn from each bag and the winner gets to take home the goodies!
Raffle tickets are \$1 each, 6 for \$5, 15 for \$10 and 35 for \$20.

If an item did not have any tickets submitted, the contributor is responsible for taking it home.

June 5 - Vicki Hodge

Vicki has been designing and piecing reproduction scrap quilts for over 40 years. An accumulation of unquilted tops naturally lead to pairing two tops into one quilt - equally interesting on front and back. Vicki teamed with Quiltmania Editions to publish 'Button



Box Quilts' in September, 2018. The book includes 20 designs (10 quilts) inspired by 19th century patterns.

Vicki has exhibited quilts at the Pour l'Amour du Fil show in Nantes, France; the Paducah Quilt Week Show in Paducah, Kentucky; and 'In the American Tradition' exhibit at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, Texas. Her AQSG Civil War Quilt Study quilt was selected to travel to several locations over four years.

The guild program trunk show includes quilts included in the book and those that didn't make the cut. Discussion of her quilting process is included along the way

The June meeting will also feature the Illinois Quilters Inc., annual raffle quilt. They will be selling tickets for a chance to win this beautiful quilt. This quilt will go on to be displayed as part of the Fine Art Fiber Show held at the



Chicago Botanical Garden in November.

Time: 10:00am


Place: Pine Dunes Forest Preserve (42909 Hunt Club Road) in Antioch.

Book Reviews – New this Month!

New this month are book reviews by our own members! This first offering is written by Nann Hilyard, thank you, Nann!

QUILT OF SOULS

Phyllis Biffle Elmore Charlesbridge, 2023

The title pulled me in: quilts! But the stories kept me turning the pages. Phyllis Elmore's memoir is compelling and inspirational.

In 1957 four-year-old Phyllis was taken from her family in Detroit to live with her maternal grandparents in rural Alabama. She does not go into details about why, but the result was life-changing in the very best way. Grandma Lula was patient and caring. She knew just how to ease the little girl's fears.

Lula was renowned for her memory quilts. When someone "passed over" (Phyllis learned not to say "died") their families commissioned Lula to make quilts from the loved one's clothing. As she cut and stitched she told stories about strong, determined, and courageous people. "...I used to imaging G.C. wandering in a clear space, looking for someone he could romp and run with. Wen Grandma sewed his brothers into the quilt it felt like he was no longer along...Their fabric, those pieces of corduroy, wool, and denim, were arranged throughout the sides an middle of my quilt of souls. Then Grandma put a strip of G.C.'s gray britches along the left edge. Looking at it, I imagined him running down to the spring to romp and splash around, and I smiled." (p/ 130)

Lula's own parents were born into slavery. She knew first-hand the experience of separated families. For many years she worked as a nanny/housekeeper for a white family, making a long daily round trip by wagon and car (though she did not drive) because she had her own children and household.

The personalities that Elmore writes about are memorable -- not only Grandma Lula and Grandpa Edgar but also Miss Sugar and Miss Evelyn, Mama Nall, Aunt Bessie, and Sheriff Scruggs. Just as all the fabric in a scrappy quilt combines and blends to an intriguing (and most often pleasing) whole, all of the people we encounter contribute to the quilt of our lives.

There is a ruler for that. Take a peek at the Updated Missouri Star Block books and grab a new ruler to make something beautiful.

Need help cutting binding? We have Accquilt dies to cut 1.5, 2.5 and 3.5 dies to cut accurate strips. Doing a rag quilt? There is a die for that. Cut up to (6) 8.5" squares at a time, rag cuts included. Don't have a cutter? We do have 1 hand die cutter to lend out.


Batik Rip Reminder




