Upcoming Meeting Information

November 6 – April Soulak-Andrews Founder of Penny's Purpose

The Penny's Purpose was founded in October 2019 by April Soulak-Andrews, as a heartfelt tribute to her late mother, Penny Soulak, who sadly passed away in July 2019 after a brief illness. Penny's life was marked by a deep commitment to giving, whether it was extending a helping hand to people or animals in need. Even in times when resources were limited, Penny always found a way to make a positive impact. This unwavering spirit inspired our mission statement, which is encapsulated by the phrase, "Learn to give, even when blessed with less."

During Penny's time in hospice care, a family friend gifted her a warm and comforting blanket, which provided solace and comfort during her difficult journey. After Penny's passing, April found herself in need of warmth one day and reached for the same blanket that had once provided her mother with comfort. In that poignant moment, April felt a calling within her. She decided to channel her mother's love for blankets, combined with her innate generosity towards people and animals, into the creation of The Penny's Purpose.

Since 2019, The Penny's Purpose has annually hosted a blanket drive spanning from November 1st to December 15th. The initiative collects both new, homemade and gently used blankets. Beneficiaries include Willow House, Reach Rescue, PADS of Lake County, ELCA of Kenosha, Love Inc., among others. To date, the drives have amassed a total of 7,000 blankets.

In addition to presenting at our November meeting, our members are invited to attend The Penny's Purpose annual blanket making party November 9th at the Antioch VFW. January 8 - From fast fashion to sustainable stitching



It follows the journey from the fashion world to the world of upcycled and denim quilts; from creative reuse centers to QuiltCon. Radha Weaver is sustainability educator and quilter based in San Francisco. Her upcycled denim quilts have been

seen in Quilting Arts and Fibert Art Now magazines and at QuiltCon. Her unique expertise and passion for sustainability and specifically upcycling denim was fueled by a 15-year career in the apparel and textile industry where she had a front seat to the rise of fast fashion. She used to create products for Levi's and was responsible for getting millions of pairs of jeans out into the world. Now she helps keep those same jeans out of a landfill by teaching quilters and sewists to create with upcycled materials.

Radha can be found online as Sewing through Fog where sustainability is approached with humor and delight, and no one is shamed for buying new fabric.

February 5 – Beth Helfter

Author, pattern designer, and national quilting instructor Beth Helfter has one rule about quilting - it's supposed to be fun. With that in mind, along



with her company motto of "Inspired Designs, Relaxed Attitude," Beth brings visionary designs and techniques to her patterns and exuberance and encouragement to the classroom.

Looking for staid or typical? You won't find it here.

Beth has never met a scrap she didn't appreciate, and prefers to dig into her stash to create designs and patterns that appeal to her senses of color and value, using as many different fabrics as possible. Keeping to just a few color families in each quilt palette is one of her best tricks to keeping scrappy quilts from getting too out of hand but allowing them to sing with tone and movement. As a member of Quiltmaker Magazine's 2014 Scrap Squad, she recreated a design from each of six issues using only scraps, and was able to bring out different secondary designs and block highlights simply by adding more tone and value, as scrap guilts will do. Her popular lecture "Consistency in the Chaos" seeks to inspire quilters to think about scrap quilts and pull fabrics to make them shine without overwhelming the eye. Beth has decided she will never solve the mystery of why even scrap quilters can never use up their fabrics, and no longer even tries.

Her penchant for scraps and her need to use as many fabrics as possible in her quilts led her in 2017 to develop the Accordion Sewn HSTs[™] method of creating half square triangles that don't have a match and yet waste no fabric. Delving into the method further, she discovered "ordering" the accordions could lead to the creation of whole blocks and quilts from a single accordion. Her first book on the method "Oompah! Jazz Up Your Scrap Quilts with Accordion Sewn HSTs[™] was published in 2018, and "Another Round of Oompah" was published in 2020. It's been called "life-changing," "magical," "addictive," and, her favorite, "witchcraft," and is the basis for many of her most popular lectures and workshops. She's currently at work on new variations of the basic Accordion Sewn HSTs[™].

Since founding EvaPaige Quilt Designs in 2005, she has published a vast range of scrappy patterns and her work has been featured in various quilting magazines and on well-known quilting websites. As a traveling quilt teacher, she's visited guilds coast to coast and taught at national and regional quilt shows, and never tires of the ah-ha moments and banter of a classroom full of quilters.

Beth resides in Pepperell MA with her cute but calendar-obsessed husband, three delightful but dramatic teenage and almost adult daughters, and a psychotic but adorable cat.

Challenge Quilt Exchange

The December meeting we will kick off our Challenge Quilt Exchange.

Please bring four half yard cuts of fabric. The exchange will start by drawing numbers to find the member you will exchange with. If you draw one of four red numbers you may choose to switch with anyone you want or keep what you received.

Your instructions are to use most of the four half yards in a pattern of your choice. You can add background, sashing/cornerstones and borders to make this quilt, just make sure that the four half yard cuts are the star of the quilt. Quilt should be no larger than lap sized. There will be a \$10.00 fee that will cover 1st, 2nd and 3rd place prizes at the end of the challenge.

Please bring your fabric to the November meeting, the exchange will happen at the Christmas party. If you are unable to be at either meeting, please give your fabric to Michael, he will help with the exchange. <u>Programs@nlcqg.org</u>

What to do with Elmer

Have you ever thought about using Elmer's School Glue? It can be a part of your quilting necessities!

Elmer can be used to baste two pieces of fabric together. Put a very thin line of glue 1/8" from the edge of the fabric, put the second piece, right sides together over the glue, finger press together. Iron to seal the seam. You have basted two pieces of fabric together and can sew them together when you have time.

Elmer can baste a quilt. Place batting on a flat surface, then put a squiggle of glue across the center of the batting. Carefully place the quilt top on the batting. Smooth out the fabric and glue. Continue placing glue and top until you reach the top. Repeat the process to baste the bottom of the sandwich. Then turn the quilt over and repeat the process on the backing. Finally, iron to seal the basting. You can quilt the sandwich when you have time (no pins to stick you!). You can quilt over the dried glue. When you have finished the quilting and binding, you can wash and dry the quilt and the glue will wash out! (P.S. you can glue the binding down, too.)

Elmer can also be used to applique. Place a small, thin line of glue on the applique piece. Place it on the background, iron and you can sew later.

So what to do with Elmer? Everything!
